Looking after your eyes is important



- People with learning disabilities are **10 times more likely** to have serious problems with their eye sight.
- Some people might not know they have a sight problem. They might not be able to tell other people that they can't see.



- Being able to see is important for a lot of things like -

Going to work

Doing activities and hobbies

Getting around

Communicating with others

Looking after yourself and your home

Being independent and making choices.



- Everyone can have a sight test. You don't have to be able to read or speak.
- Everyone can look after their eyes and sight with the right help.

- SeeAbility wants to tell as many people as they can that looking after your eyes is very important.
- We are looking for people with learning disabilities in groups around the UK to help.
- Your group can help by doing training to other people with a learning disability how to look after their eyes.

- **Opening Doors** is working with SeeAbility to make a training pack about eye care and why it is important.
- Opening Doors used to be called People First of Norfolk and are an advocacy group run by people with learning disabilities. They have a lot of experience in training.
- Each group in the network will be trained about eye care by SeeAbility and Opening Doors. Each group will be given a pack with everything they to do the training.
- The groups will then train people in their area about eye care and why it is important
- In the future, we will also want to train opticians and health workers. This will make eye care services better for everyone.
