## We are doing a research study

• To try to improve cancer care for children and young people, including those with a learning disability or who are autistic



- We will do this by asking children and young people, parents and hospital staff about their experiences and visiting the wards to see how care is provided
- We want to use lots of creative ways to help children to take part



## Can you help us?

We are looking for young people (aged 10-15) who have had cancer to be in a group to help us with this study.

We will ask the group to help us make some decisions, like:

- The best information to give children and young people about the study
- Making sure information we give is easy for all children to understand
- Thinking about the best way to talk with children and young people about receiving cancer care
- What might be the best, creative and fun ways for children to tell us about their experience











- We will **meet 6 times a year** and you can choose how many you attend (between January 2024-December 2025)
- The meetings will last about 1½ hours
- The meetings will mostly be by online video calls
- You can have someone with you in the meeting to help you (like a family member or support worker)
- If it is possible to meet in person, the meetings will be at Great Ormond Street Hospital, London
- If we need your help in between meetings, we might get in touch with you by email or phone
- You can get in touch with us by email or by phone
- At the end of the project the group will finish



- We will give you a £20 shopping thank you voucher for helping us in each meeting
- We will provide support for you to take part
- We will pay for you to travel to Great Ormond Street Hospital, if we meet in person
